St John's Sunshine Sunshine Grants



What's it all about? St John's Sunshine (SJS) is a Voluntary and Community Benefit Society based at St John's Centre in Old Trafford, and we earn cash from the sun. SJS seeks to: reduce the carbon footprint of Old Trafford; provide 'Sunshine Grants' for community projects; offer the chance for people to own shares or become a member of SJS; enable individuals to take part in and learn from the enterprise; and involve more people in working together to make Old Trafford a better place.

Being a kind of co-op, we're run by our members. Anyone can be a member at any time for a one-off membership charge of £1 and a small annual subscription of just £10. No one gets paid a wage at SJS - we exist just to support others and do a little for the environment – but we do have to post stuff, print from time to time and put on events. The little income from subscriptions helps keep things ticking over. Visit www.stjohnssunshine.org.uk for more information.

Since February 2012, our solar panels on the roof of St John's Church have not only saved some carbon emissions, but have earned cash from the Feed-In Tariff too. We're using £1,000 of this money to offer our sixth round of Sunshine Grants - limiting applications to a maximum of £250 each, so up to 4 projects (or more if bids are for less than £250) will receive help.

Who can apply? Residents who've clubbed together (two or more people), voluntary groups, community organisations, local charities, schools, or others – anyone who wants to help people, communities and/or the environment in Old Trafford. Your group doesn't need to have a constitution, rules or a formal structure, just a shared idea.

What can you apply for? There isn't a long list of do's and don'ts. If you work or live in Old Trafford and can show that your idea will add to the community or the environment, and isn't to the detriment of either, your project has a good chance of getting a grant. That's it. You can apply for anything that will help you to realise your idea – whether it's a few trees, a workshop, a painting to cheer up a dull space, cooking pots, exercise mats, or something else... it's up to you.

Who decides, how and when? The Directors will check that your idea falls within the aims and intentions of SJS. Then our members will vote for their favourite ideas, and the successful groups will be notified by 20th December 2024.

When it's all over Once projects are completed, successful groups will be asked to provide some kind of evidence to show that their project has happened - what this looks like is up to you. Receipts are a minimum but you should provide one other thing at least, maybe a photo, a summary of what happened, a link to a social media post, or a clip from a local paper. Please mention St John's Sunshine in any publicity!
